- Please book your holidays during planned school holidays only.

Homework

- Please refer to our Homework Policy on the school website.
- Reading is a priority. Reading at least 3 times per week and recording in Reading Record. This can be a book taken from school or an appropriately challenging book/text from home.
- New! Parents/carers need to read with their child or children three times a week and sign their reading diary. This is the only mandatory homework. Miss Hegarty does not record her school reading sessions in this diary. The children have 4 30 minute sessions a week and 15 minutes of story time daily, as well as 1: 1 readers depending on the child. The children's reading records are checked weekly.
- There is a school reading race. The class will earn points depending on how many children have read 3 times at home.
- Younger children will read through a combination of ORT, Dandelion and Reading Planets banded books, matched to their ability. Once your child is confident enough, they will move off the banded books scheme and given time to choose their own book from a selection of mainstream novels in class.
- Your child's book will be changed on a Friday afternoon, so please ensure that your child has their reading diary that day. Your child will be given 2 books a week to read. If you would like more, super! Please let Miss Hegarty or Mrs Jones know.
- Communication from teacher/Parent Mail reminders if Reading Records regularly unused. We understand things crop up.
- Coming soon an information session for parents about how children learn to read and you can support them. Details to follow! In the mean time, please look through the handout stuck in your child's reading diary. This will help support your child's reading skills.
- Half-termly maths, phonics/spelling and topic grids which link to the learning for the following halfterm. Picking a task from each grid every week will greatly support your child in their learning.
- Parents can choose which tasks and how often/long they wish their child to spend on a task this is dependent on the individual child's age and ability. There is no expectation to hand in (the work is not marked) but you child can bring into show and will receive praise/incentives.

Expectations and Transition

- End of Year Expectation Booklets available on class webpage (Parents Information > Curriculum Pages > Maths / English
- Work pitched to appropriately challenge groups or individuals
- There are in class intervention for those who need additional support. This can be on a 1:1 basis or in small groups.
- At the end of last year, Miss Hegarty and Mrs Parkin and Mrs Clements had a in depth transition meeting to pass on interventions etc.

Curriculum

- Leyland Trucks- history- history of transport, including Henry Ford, George Stephenson and The Wright Brothers.
- Design and Technology- the class will be planning, designing and building their own car.
- Mary Anning- history- we will be learning about the Victorians (the era that Mary Anning was born) and dinosaurs including fossils.
- Design and Technology- we will be designing and sewing our own purses/wallets. We will be learning 3 different stiches.
- Our Local Area- geography topic- we will be studying our surrounding area including looking at OS maps and how to read them.
- Africa- geography based topic looking at climate, map work and links to animals and habitats for our science topic.
