MAKE

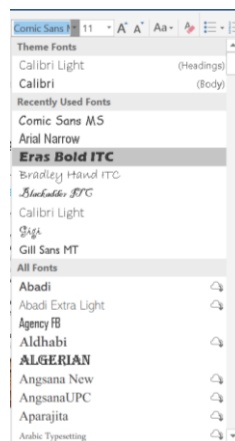
Make your own pop-up book based on something you find interesting.

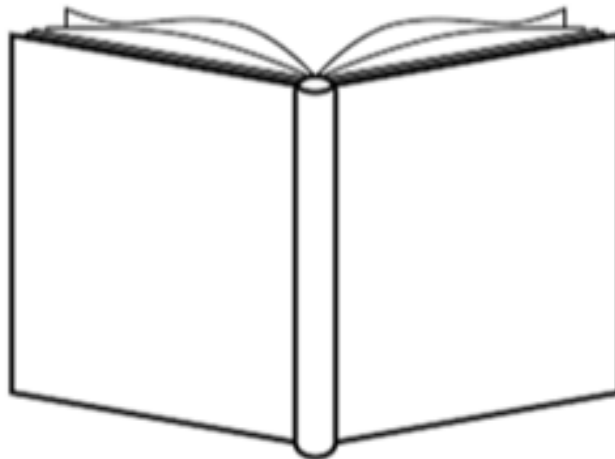
EVALUATE
