Promoting British Values at Lancaster Lane School

The DfE has recently reinforced the need ***“to create and enforce a clear and rigorous expectation on all schools to promote the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.”***

The government set out its definition of British values in the 2011 Prevent Strategy, and these values have been reiterated by the Prime Minister this year. At Lancaster Lane, these values are reinforced regularly and in the following ways:

Democracy

We listen to each other and value what others say. Through the School Council we have a strong pupil voice.

The Rule of Law

We all follow our class rules. We treat others how we would want to be treated. Certificates, stickers and Golden Time reward our outstanding behaviour.
